E74. Redistricting

Statement: At its January, 1937, meeting the board of directors by resolution divided the territory covered by member clubs of Rotary International into districts numbered and described as set forth in the resolution, copy of which was filed with the minutes of the January board meeting. The board also delegated to the executive committee the exercise of all the powers and rights which the board has under Section 1 of Article XI of the by-laws of Rotary International and delegated to the executive committee full power and authority to act in the premises on the board's behalf.

Subsequent to the January meeting of the board it became apparent that certain alterations in the district boundaries as described in the resolution of the board were both advisable and necessary. One of these being of major importance was submitted to the executive committee through ballot-by-mail (See Item E57, page 1 of these minutes) and was acted upon favorably. The others (some being but technical details) have been made with the approval of the president.

Decision: WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority vested in them by the general redistricting resolution adopted by the board at its January, 1937, meeting, and at the instance of all or most of the clubs concerned, the president and the executive committee revised the boundaries of the new districts, which were created to effect a division of the 18th and 52nd districts, and the boundaries of the new districts which were created to effect a division of the 41st, 47th, and 48th districts; and notice of the revision of the boundaries of these districts was immediately given to the clubs in the old districts in ample time to permit of protests prior to March 15, 1937.

A. Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the board of directors of Rotary International, the executive committee acting in its behalf, that the action taken by the president and by the executive committee in respect to the boundaries of the foregoing districts, is hereby ratified and confirmed so that the descriptions of districts 18-A and 18-B, 52, 41, 47-A, and 47-B, and 48 be as hereinafter set out in this resolution:

B. And BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the board of directors of R.I., the executive committee acting in its behalf, that, in accordance with the provisions of the constitution and by-laws of R.I. and pursuant to the action of the board of directors of R.I. at its January, 1937, meeting, and pursuant to and in accordance with the letter of promulgation of the president dated January 18, 1937, the following new districts, and districts with redefined boundaries, are declared to have become legally effective on March 15, 1937:

DISTRICT 2-A—CALIFORNIA (the counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, Lake, Sonoma, Napa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and the territory of the Rotary Club of Vallejo), and the HAWAIIAN ISLANDS.

DISTRICT 2-B—CALIFORNIA (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Siskiyou, Trinity, Tehama, Glenn, Colusa, Yolo, Solano—excepting the territory of the Rotary Club of Vallejo—Contra Costa, and Alameda, and north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Mendocino, Santa Clara, San Joaquin, Amador, and Alpine), and NEVADA (excepting the county of Clark).

DISTRICT 2-C—CALIFORNIA (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Amador, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Merced, and east of the eastern, south of the southern, and west of the western boundaries of the county of San Benito, and south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Monterey, San Joaquin, Amador, and Alpine, and west of the western boundaries of the counties of Inyo, San Bernardino, and Los Angeles, and north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Los Angeles, and Inyo).

DISTRICT 2-D—CALIFORNIA (the county of Inyo and the county of Los Angeles, excepting that portion lying east of a line drawn along the Los Angeles River from the mouth to Artesia street, then east on Artesia Street to San Gabriel River, thence along San Gabriel River and Prairie Creek to the county line), and NEVADA (the county of Clark).

DISTRICT 2-E—CALIFORNIA (the counties of Imperial, San Diego, Riverside, Orange, San Bernardino—excepting that portion east of longitude 115° and south of latitude 35°—and Los Angeles County, excepting that portion lying west of a line drawn along the Los Angeles River from the mouth to Artesia Street, thence east on Artesia Street to San Gabriel River, thence along San Gabriel River and Prairie Creek to the county line).

DISTRICT 8-A—KANSAS (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Marshall, Riley, Geary, Morris, Chase, Greenwood, Elk, and Chautauqua, and west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Doniphan, Atchison, Leavenworth, Douglas, Osage, Coffey, Greenwood, Elk, and Chautauqua).

DISTRICT 8-B—KANSAS (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Marshall, Riley, Geary, Morris, Chase, Greenwood, Elk, and Chautauqua), and OKLAHOMA (the counties of Cimarron, Texas, and Beaver).

DISTRICT 12-A—OKLAHOMA (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Osage, Pawnee, Lincoln, Pottawatomie, Pontotoc, Johnston, and Marshall, and west of longitude 96° 50' in Payne county, and east of the eastern boundary of the county of Beaver).

DISTRICT 12-B—OKLAHOMA (the counties of Osage, Pawnee, Lincoln, Pottawatomie, Seminole, Pontotoc, Johnston, and Marshall, and Payne county east of longitude 96° 50').

DISTRICT 14-A—MISSOURI (that portion east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Putnam, Sullivan, Linn, Chariton, Howard, Cooper, Moniteau, Morgan, Camden, Laclede, Wright, Douglas, and Ozark).

DISTRICT 14-B—MISSOURI (that portion west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Putnam, Sullivan, Linn, Chariton, Howard, Cooper, Moniteau, Morgan, and Camden, and east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Nodaway, Andrew, Buchanan, Clay, Jackson, Cass, and Bates, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Clinton, St. Clair, Hickory, and Camden).

DISTRICT 15—KANSAS (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Montgomery, Wilson, Woodson, Anderson, Franklin, Johnson, and Wyandotte), OKLAHOMA (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Washington, Tulsa, Creek, Okfuskee, Hughes, Coal, Atoka, and Bryan), MISSOURI (that portion west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Nodaway, Andrew, Buchanan, Clay, Jackson, Cass, Bates, Laclede, Wright, Douglas, and Ozark, and that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Cedar, Polk, Dallas, and Laclede), and ARKANSAS (that portion west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Marion, Searcy, Franklin, Logan, Scott, and Montgomery, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Polk, Montgomery, Newton, and Searcy).

DISTRICT 17-A—LOUISIANA (except the counties of St. Helena, Tangipahoa, Livingston, Washington, St. Tammany, St. Charles, St. John The Baptist, Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard, and Plaquemines), and MISSISSIPPI (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Sharkey, Yazoo, Hines, Copiah, Lincoln, and Pike).

DISTRICT 17-B—MISSISSIPPI (that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Sharkey, Yazoo, Madison, Leake, Neshoba, and Kemper, and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Sharkey, Yazoo, Hines, Copiah, Lincoln, and Pike) and LOUISIANA (the counties of St. Helena, Tangipahoa, Livingston, Washington, St. Tammany, St. Charles, St. John The Baptist, Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard, and Plaquemines).

DISTRICT 18-A—KENTUCKY (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Boone, Grant, Scott, Fayette, Jessamine, Garrard, Lincoln, Pulaski, and McCreary).

DISTRICT 18-B—KENTUCKY (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Boone, Grant, Scott, Fayette, Jessamine, Garrard, Lincoln, Pulaski, and McCreary).

DISTRICT 19-A—SOUTH DAKOTA and IOWA (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Dickinson, Clay, Buena Vista, Sac, Carroll, Audubon, Cass, Adams, and Taylor).

DISTRICT 19-B—NEBRASKA (except the county of Scotts Bluff).

DISTRICT 21-A—OHIO (that portion north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Darke, Miami, Champaign, Union, Delaware, Knox, and Holmes, and west of the western boundaries of the counties of Cuyahoga, Summit, Stark, and Tuscarawas).

DISTRICT 21-B—OHIO (that portion north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Tuscarawas and Belmont, and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Cuyahoga, Summit, Stark, Tuscarawas, and Belmont).

DISTRICT 22—OHIO (that portion south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Darke, Miami, Champaign, Union, Delaware, Knox, Holmes, Tuscarawas, and Belmont).

DISTRICT 23-N—MICHIGAN (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Presque Isle, Montmorency, Oscoda, Ogemaw, Clare, Isabella, Gratiot, and Shiawassee, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Gratiot, Shiawassee, Genesee, Lapeer, Macomb, and St. Clair, and south of the northern boundary of the county of Clare), and ONTARIO (the counties of Bruce, Elgin, Grey, Huron, Lambton, Middlesex, Oxford, and Perth).

DISTRICT 23-S—MICHIGAN (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Livingston, Washtenaw, and Lenawee, and south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Shiawassee, Genesee, Lapeer, Macomb, and St. Clair), and ONTARIO (the counties of Essex and Kent).

DISTRICT 27—NEW YORK (that portion west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Orleans, Genesee, and Allegany, and south of the southern, west of the western, and north of the northern boundaries of the county of Wyoming), and ONTARIO (that portion between longitudes 78° and 85°, excepting the Algoma counties west of longitude 82° 30' and south of latitude 47°, and excepting also that portion lying west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Grey, Huron, Perth, Oxford, and Elgin).

DISTRICT 28-A—NEW YORK (that portion west of longitude 76° 30', and east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Orleans, Genesee, and Allegany, and south of the northern, east of the western, and north of the southern boundaries of the county of Wyoming), and ONTARIO (that portion south of latitude 45° lying between longitude 76° and 78°, excluding the territory of the Rotary Club of Smiths Falls).

DISTRICT 28-B—NEW YORK (that portion east of longitude 76° 30', and west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Broome, Otsego, Herkimer, and Hamilton, and north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Delaware, Fulton, Warren, and Washington), ONTARIO (that portion east of longitude 78° north of latitude 45°, and east of longitude 76° south of latitude 45° including the territory of the Rotary Club of Smith Falls), and QUEBEC (that portion west of longitude 73°).

DISTRICT 32—NOVA SCOTIA, NEW BRUNSWICK, NEWFOUNDLAND, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, QUEBEC (that portion east of longitude 68°), and MAINE (the counties of Aroostook and Washington).

DISTRICT 33-A—PENNSYLVANIA (that portion west of the eastern boundary of the county of Somerset, and south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Somerset, Westmoreland, Allegheny, and Beaver).

DISTRICT 33-B—PENNSYLVANIA (that portion west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Cambria, and McKean and west of longitude 78° 30' in the counties of Elk and Clearfield, and north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Somerset, Westmoreland, Allegheny, and Beaver).

DISTRICT 36-A—NEW JERSEY (that portion north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Mercer and Middlesex).

DISTRICT 36-B—NEW JERSEY (that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Mercer and Middlesex), and DELAWARE.

DISTRICT 37—VERMONT, NEW HAMPSHIRE (that portion west of longitude 71°), and QUEBEC (that portion lying between longitudes 68° and 73°).

DISTRICT 38—MAINE (excepting the counties of Aroostook and Washington), NEW HAMPSHIRE (that portion east of longitude 71°), and MASSACHUSETTS (that portion east of longitude 71° and north of latitude 42° 45' excepting the city of Amesbury).

DISTRICT 40—ILLINOIS (that portion north of the northern boundaries of the counties of Rock Island, Henry, Stark, Peoria, Woodford, Livingston, Ford, and Iroquois).

DISTRICT 41—TEXAS (that portion north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Winkler, Ector, Midland, Glasscock, Sterling, Coke, Taylor, Callahan, Eastland, Comanche, Erath, Somervell, and Tarrant, and west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Somervell, Hood, Tarrant, Wise, and Montague).

DISTRICT 44—ILLINOIS (that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Rock Island, Henry, Stark, and Peoria, and west of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Peoria, Tazewell, Mason, Menard, Sangamon, Macoupin, and Madison, and north of the southern boundary of the county of Madison).

DISTRICT 45-A—ILLINOIS (that portion south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Madison, Bond, Fayette, Effingham, Jasper, and Crawford).

DISTRICT 45-B—ILLINOIS (that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Iroquois, Ford, Livingston, and Woodford, and east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Peoria, Tazewell, Mason, Menard, Sangamon, Macoupin, and Madison, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Bond, Fayette, Effingham, Jasper, and Crawford).

DISTRICT 47-A—TEXAS (that portion south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Ector, Midland, Glasscock, Sterling, Coke, Taylor, Callahan, Eastland, Comanche, Refugio, and Aransas, and east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Ward, Pecos, and Terrell, and west of the western boundaries of the counties of Refugio, Victoria, De Witt, Lavaca, Fayette, Washington, Burleson, Milam, Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, and Comanche).

DISTRICT 47-B—TEXAS (that portion south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Sabine, San Augustine, Nacogdoches, Cherokee, Anderson, Freestone, Limestone, McLennan, and Coryell, and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Bell, Milam, Burleson, Washington, Fayette, Lavaca, De Witt, Victoria, and Refugio, and north of the south boundaries of the counties of Refugio and Aransas).

DISTRICT 48—TEXAS (that portion east of the eastern boundaries of the counties of Montague, Wise, Tarrant, Hood, Somervell, Mills, and Lampasas, and southeast of the southeastern boundaries of the counties of Somervell, Erath, and Comanche, and north of the northern and south of the southern boundaries of the county of Tarrant, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Coryell, McLennan, Limestone, Freestone, Anderson, Cherokee, Nacogdoches, San Augustine, and Sabine), and **ARKANSAS** (Miller county).

DISTRICT 50—PENNSYLVANIA (the counties of Northampton, Lehigh, Berks, Bucks, Montgomery, Chester, Delaware, and Philadelphia).

DISTRICT 52—TENNESSEE (excepting the county of Shelby and that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Hancock, Hawkins, and Greene).

DISTRICT 56-A—VIRGINIA (that portion south of the southern boundaries of the counties of Loudoun and Fairfax, and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Fauquier, Rappahannock, Madison, Greene, Albemarle, Buckingham, Appomattox, Charlotte, and Halifax), and **NORTH CAROLINA** (that portion north of Albemarle Sound and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Gates and Chowan).

DISTRICT 56-B—VIRGINIA (that portion west of the western boundaries of the counties of Loudoun, Fauquier, Rappahannock, Madison, Greene, Albemarle, Buckingham, Appomattox, Charlotte, and Halifax), and **TENNESSEE** (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Hancock, Hawkins, and Greene).

DISTRICT 57-A—NORTH CAROLINA (that portion east of the western boundaries of the counties of Rockingham, Guilford, and Onslow, and north of the southern boundaries of the counties of Guilford, Alamance, Orange, and Durham, and northeast of the southwestern boundaries of the counties of Wake, Johnston, Wayne, Lenoir, and Jones, and west of the western boundaries of the counties of Gates and Chowan, and south of Albemarle Sound).

RENUMBERING OF DISTRICTS IN R.I.

Statement: As a result of the redistricting program promulgated by the board of directors, and which became effective March 15, 1937, it appears desirable to renumber the USCNB districts. The USCNB members of the board en route to Europe studied this matter and proposed a plan whereby only those districts in the USCNB will be renumbered within the numbers from 101 to 200. All districts outside the USCNB will retain their present numbers except as and until they may be redistricted.

Decision: The board of directors approves the renumbering of districts in the USCNB as proposed in the plan outlined as follows:

138. Renumbering of Districts

Statement: The board at its July 1948 meeting approved in principle the renumbering of districts, to be effective July 1, 1949, and requested the districting committee to advise the board for its guidance in the renumbering of the districts what numbers should be left unassigned to accommodate future districting.

The board at its January meeting gave consideration to a draft plan for the renumbering of districts which had been prepared on the basis of the suggested plan considered by the board at its July meeting and the recommendation of the districting committee as to numbers to be left unassigned to accommodate future districting.

Decision: The board agrees that, effective 1 July, 1949, the districts of R.I. shall be renumbered as follows:

218. Renumbering of Districts

Statement: The board, at its January, 1956, meeting, agreed that, effective 1 July, 1957, the districts of R.I. shall be renumbered, and designated the general allocation of district numbers to the various regions of the Rotary world.

As requested by the board, the R.I. districting committee presented to the board at this meeting a plan for specific district numbering within the general allocation indicated.

Decision: The board adopts a plan for the numbering of districts whereby districts in the regions listed hereunder shall be designated within the number allocations indicated as follows:

- 100-199 European, North African and Eastern Mediterranean region
- 200-299 Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and other places not included in any other group
- 300-399 Asia (except that portion included in the ENAEM region)
- 400-499 South America, Central America, Mexico and the Antilles
- 500-799 United States of America, Canada and Bermuda

and agrees that, effective 1 July, 1957, existing districts of R.I. shall be renumbered as follows:

262. Renumbering of Districts

Statement: The board, at its first meeting in 1975-76, referred to the districting committee for study and report to the board the subject of the current numbering system for designating districts in R.I. and requested the committee to submit to the board its recommendation for a new system of numbering of districts which would take into account and allow for the creation of new districts in future years in the various regions into which Rotary clubs were grouped for administrative purposes.

At its October, 1975, meeting the districting committee offered to the board a choice of plans for the numbering of districts designed to provide for 1) a short term solution covering up to ten years; 2) a solution spanning perhaps ten to twenty years; 3) a solution spanning a period of up to twenty-five years and; 4) a system that would provide for a complete renumbering of districts worldwide to preserve the practice of sequential numbering according to country and other factors.

The committee recommended Plan 3 because, in its judgment, the plan would cause the least disruption of existing numbering while best resolving the current shortage of numbers in some regions; twenty-five years being, in the opinion of the committee, a reasonable time for which to plan ahead.

The board, at its January, 1976, meeting, agreed to establish a new system for the numbering of districts as recommended by the committee in its Plan 3, and requested the districting committee to reallocate numbers following the guidelines in said plan and report thereon to the board at this meeting.

At its June, 1976, meeting, the committee gave further study to this matter and reiterated its recommendation based on the desirability of creating as little disruption as possible in existing district numbers. The committee was mindful that clubs and districts had, collectively, a large investment in property and materials on which district numbers appeared and that changes in these numbers could in some instances be costly. The committee endeavored to reallocate numbers within the guidelines adopted by the board so as to provide for future growth in the number of districts and to maintain the numbering system according to country, where possible, while at the same time keeping changes in numbers to a minimum. In most cases a change in only one digit would be necessary.

The districting committee made a recommendation, which was concurred in by the board at this meeting, as reflected in the decision recorded hereunder.

Decision: The board adopts a plan for the numbering of districts whereby districts in the regions listed hereunder shall be designated within the numbered allocations indicated as follows:
