1938 - 39

President: Rtn. N.S.Subba Rao Secretary: Rtn. H..Richardson

Presented a Deep X-Ray Radium Plant, at a cost of Rs.20,000/- to the Victoria Hospital in Bangalore. The amount was raised through a carnival organised at the Sampangi Stadium.

This was the first major public service project of the Club, and the forerunner of innumerable outstanding services rendered to the community.

1946 - 47

President: Rtn. J.C.Ghosh Secretary: Rtn. M.N.Mahadevan

Collected Rs.12,500/- by way of donations and sale proceeds of a benefit dance recital by the internationally famed danseuse Mrinalini Sarabhai. The amount was presented to the Mysore University Council for awarding scholarships to poor students out of the interest

accruing from it. This was to be the Arranged for water supply to a colony nucleus of a fund which was expected to be raised to Rs.1 lakh in the coming years.

Started the Dayanand Maternity Home and Clinic at Bannerghatta for the exclusive benefit of womenfolk from nearby villages. Besides the heavy investment needed to start the Clinic, the members of the Club undertook to contribute towards the expenses of running it, every month.

1947 - 48

President: Rtn. C.Subramanya Iyer Secretary: Rtn. D.N.Hosali

Adopted Kadugodi village near Whitefield, and sponsored a Welfare Centre. This was established and handed over to the Club in a flourishing condition by Col. Bennet of the Indian Ordnance and Welfare Depot in September 1947. The Centre had a primary school, crèche, nursery, firstaid clinic, indoor games and adult literacy classes. The Club itself looked after the Centre from 1947 to 1953.

1948 - 49

President: Rtn. D.N.Hosali Secretary: Rtn. N.R.Parthasarathy

The Club began taking interest in a Hostel for Harijans at Seshadripuram in Bangalore, the foundation for which was laid by Mahatma Gandhi. More than 400 Harijan children of tender age were being educated and maintained in the Hostel. The Club rendered much financial help for running the institution.

Donated Rs.6,500/- to the Welfare Centre at Whitefield.

1952 – 53 President: Rtn. Walter Sobol Secretary: B.S.Sud

The Rotary Anns' Club of Bangalore was formed in March 1952. This was the first Club in India for Rotary Anns.

The Rotary Anns assumed responsibility for the upkeep of the primary school at Kadugodi village and teaching the villagers about hygiene, child-care and vegetable gardening. They also presented books to the poor children in the school.

The membership Roster was compiled and published for the first time. A brief history of the Club was incorporated in this.

The Monthly Club Bulletin was restarted under the title The Bangalore Rotarian. The first issue was published on August 15, 1952.

Started the University Students Fund with donations from Rotarians. Financial help was given to needy college students for their fees, etc.

1953 – 54 President: Rtn. V.S.Natarajan Secretary: Rtn. B.S.Sidhwa

Launched an ambitious drive to collect Rs.3 lakhs for a 100-bed Rotary T.B. Ward at S.D.S. Sanatorium as a Rotary Golden Anniversary Project. This was inaugurated on April 30 by the Minister for Health, Mysore State, at a concert sponsored by the Air Force Celebrations authorities at the B.R.V.Hall.

His Highness, the Rajpramukh of Mysore was the Chief Patron of the T.B. Fund Project. The Chief Minister of Mysore State, Shri K.Hanumanthiah, inaugurated the Rs.1 lakh raffle at the Puttanna Chetty Town Hall on June 17.

The credit for conceiving the idea and

bringing it to successful fruition through relentless efforts should go to the then President, Air Commodore S.N.Goyal.

1954 – 55 President : **Rtn. S.N.Goyal**

The draw of the raffle tickets for the Rotary Block, a wing Rotary T. B. Ward took place on April 3.

Donated the Rotary Block, a wing attached to the Ramakrishna Vidyarthi Mandiram at Basayangudi. This

The 'Pageant of Brides' organized by the Rotary Anns' Club of Bangalore at B.R.V. Theatre, a Race Ball Dance organized by the Bowring Institute and dramas by the Bangalore Amateur Dramatic Society, were some of the programmes held during the year to raise funds for the Rotary T.B.Ward.

The foundation-stone for the Rotary T.B. Ward at the S.D.S. Sanatorium was laid by Shri. T.Channiah, Minister for Health, Mysore State.

Created a Book Bank for the benefit of commerce students.

1956 – 57 President: Rtn. B.S.Sidhwa Secretary: V.S.Bhatia

R.I.President Juan Paulo Lang unveiled a plaque at the Rotary T.E.Ward at the S.D.S. Sanatorium, in commemoration of his visit.

Donated the Rotary Block, a wing attached to the Ramakrishna Vidyarthi Mandiram at Basavangudi. This consists of four room located in the Western wing on the first floor of the hostel building. A plaque was unveiled in November 1956 by the R.I. President Jauan Paulo Lang, in commemoration of his visit to the Block.

Donated sports materials for indoor and outdoor games to the Beggar Colony on Magadi Road. The gift was received from the Club by Shri Nage Gowda, Minister for Industries, Mysore State, on behalf of the Committee of Management of the Beggar Colony.

A reception was accorded to 60 foreign students including 12 girls who had gathered in Bangalore for a summer camp under the aegis of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations.

1957 - 58

President: Rtn. K.S.Menon Secretary: Rtn. P.I.Joseph

Held on January 19, a Mock Session of the United Nations General Assembly – the first programme of its kind in this part of the world.

Among the very many successful and meaningful programmes carried out by the Rotary Club of Bangalore in the avenue of international service, this was perhaps the most outstanding.

A large number of enquiries came soon after from other clubs in the District and the rest of the country, probably with the intention of organizing something similar in their own clubs. Newspapers acclaimed this as a sparkling success.

Assistance came from practically everywhere - the State Government, the United States Library, universities and colleges.

The venue was the Puttanna Chetty Town Hall, the largest public hall in Bangalore at that time, equipped with proper facilities for seating, stage, acoustics, etc. But even this was found to be small, and the Club had to restrict the representation to 61 countries, each with two delegates.

Shri Vaikunta Baliga, Minister for Law and Legal Affairs, Mysore State, inaugurated the session. The President of the Rotary Club, Rtn. K.S.Menon, was unanimously chosen as President Adopted the Siddaguntapalya group of of the Session. Among those who acted as delegated of the different countries were Mr. V.P.Menon, former Secretary of State to the Government of India; Janab Mohamed Sheriff, former Minister of Mysore State; Justice K.S.Hegde of the Mysore High Court, Mr. Kodanda Rao, President of the Servants of India Society and Principals and Professors from a number of colleges.

An excellent programme meticulously planned and well-executed by Rtn. President K.S.Menon and the dedicated members of the three subcommittees under the International Services Committee.

Initiated, for the first time, a career advice scheme for school children and pre-university students.

1959 - 60

President: Rtn. C.R.V.Subban Secretary: K.Eswari Prasad

Constructed a building for the primary school and a children's playground with necessary amenities at Siddaguntapalya. A community radio, and bags and slates for school children were presented.

Members of the U.S.Trade Mission to India visited the Club and Mr. F.Feston Forbes, leader of the Mission, addressed the Club.

The Club initiated a pioneering The Rotary Anns organized a experiment in employer-employee relations by bringing together a large number of employers and labour leaders to discuss many problems of mutual interest.

A batch of 7 student members of the Project India (U.C.L.A) team of the University of California was hosted by a Rotarian family during their stay in the State.

Set up the Seva Ashrama Dispensary at Sriramapuram as a Silver Jubilee Year project. The southern end of Sriramapuram was the bleakest slum area of Bangalore where Deena Seva Sangha, a valiant team of social workers, was battling against disease, poverty and ignorance. Dispensary was handed over to the Deena Seva Sangha for day-to-day running. A panel of specialist Rotarian doctors attended the Dispensary regularly. A drug bank was established to provide free medicines to the patients.

Handloom Fashion Show parade, the proceeds of which helped in the construction of the Dispensary. A donation of Rs.10,000/- was made by Rtn. V.S. Natarajan.

The Club pioneered the Book Bank as a Silver Jubilee Project. Jointly with Ramnarayan Chellaram and Sons Charitable Trust, it sponsored a Students Aid Society for the purpose. The main objective was to assist in the creation of book banks or textbooklending libraries in engineering, medicine, science, commerce colleges and in polytechnics for the benefit of students from poor families who were unable to buy costly textbooks.

1960 - 61

Constructed a primary school building on a two-acre plot at Nagadevanahalli in Kengeri on the outskirts of Bangalore. The Panchayat was entrusted with the running of the school. The Government of Mysore contributed 50 percent of the expenditure for the building.

1962 - 63

President: Rtn. S.Rangaswami Secretary: Rtn. R.Giridhar

The Foundation stone for the Rotary House of Friendship was laid on June 3. Rtn. PDG. Dr. M.N.Mahadevan, Shri S.Nijalingappa, Chief Minister of Distributed Rs.3,250/- as examination Mysore State, and members of the Club turned the first sod to start the construction of the building.

Constructed a children's playground at Nagadevanahalli School.

Supplied equipment worth Rs.10,000/to the Children's Dental Clinic attached to the Dental College. Contributed Rs.10,000/- to the National Defence Fund.

The Students Aid Society received 75 valuable books on engineering and science subjects published by McGraw Hill, from District 669 (U.S.A.).

Presented to 8 educational institutions, 45 books on science subjects and 33 on engineering subjects, received from the Rotary Club of New Lynn, Auckland, New Zealand. Twenty science books and 55 engineering books received from District 669, U.S.A. were distributed among 10 institutions. fees for 105 students.

The Youth Activities Committee The second Interact Club was opened brought off the first Inter-School rolling Shields for boys and girls, to be awarded to the institutions which scored the highest points, were instituted by Rtn. B.Rudra. (The competition has become one of the most popular annual sports events in Bangalore).

1963 - 64

The first Interact Club in Bangalore was set up at the King George's School with Mr. Brij Singh as President. The Club was inaugurated by the President of the Rotary Club of Bangalore, Rtn. Gangadhara Setty.

> The Buyer-Seller Relations and Trades Association Sub-Committee under the Chairmanship of Rtn. M.K.Panduranga Setty organized the Ideal Home Exhibition, the first exhibition of its kind in India. This was inaugurated by the Governor of Mysore. His Highness Jayachamarajendra Wodeyar. Shri S.Nijalingappa, Chief Minister of Mysore, released the Buyers Guide published on the occasion. The purpose of the Exhibition was to present the concept of an ideal home to all sections of the community and to provide an opportunity for the manufacturers to display their products. In all, 38 well-known

organizations from all over the country participated. The items exhibited included furniture, home appliances, floor coverings, building materials, sanitary-ware and kitchen equipment. Over 50,000 people visited the Exhibition. A large number of overseas visitors wrote letters of appreciation and tribute.

1964 - 65

The Rotary Anns' Club of Bangalore came to be known as The Inner Wheel Club of Bangalore.

The panel listing the names of the Past Presidents of the Club was unveiled on April 25, at the Rotary House of Friendship.

The Students Help and Book Committee presented a large number of book and magazines to the Victoria Hospital for the use of patients.

A Patients' Library was started at the Bowring Hospital. In addition to donating a large number of books and periodicals, the Club arranged for a trolley to carry the books to the bedsides of the patients.

Added a building for a Family Planning Centre at Deen Seva Sangha in Sriramapuram.

1965 - 66

President: Rtn. Sadanand D. Ubhayakar

Secretary: Rtn. M.S.Kumar

The Book Bank project received the attention of the Government of India's Department of Education, University Grants Commission, Planning Commission and various State Governments. The Films Division of

the Government of India filmed the working of the Book Bank in some colleges, for exhibition as a documentary all over the country. All India Radio arranged for a broadcast on this project.

Distributed 60 very valuable books on various subjects to 16 institutions. These were gifts received by the Students Aid Society from the German Research Association, Bad Godesberg, West Germany, through the German Consulate in Madras. The Emergency Oxygen Service was inaugurated by the Governor of Mysore, His Excellency Shri V.V.Giri on April 1, 1966. The project, with an initial target of 100 cylinders, started with 50 cylinders at a cost of Rs.18,000/-. The project was conceived by Rtn. Dr. V.Visweshariah.

1966 - 67

The Inner Wheel Club of Bangalore was presented with the Charter on February 4.

A row of four shops was constructed in the Anatha Sishu Nivas at N.R.Colony to provide a regular income for the Nivas which then had 37 orphans. The cost of this was shared equally between the Club and the Nivas.

A group of 11 boys and 11 girls from Amitie Mondiale Interjeunesse, Paris, who had come to a work camp at Nayandahalli in Mysore Road, were felicitated. The AMI is a youth organization started in France in 1963 and has large membership in France and Belgium. Through Social service, AMI fosters international goodwill and understanding.

1969 - 70

President: Rtn. M.K.Panduranga

Organised in collaboration with the Visveswaraya Industrial and Technical Museum, a training programme on scientific hobbies. An exhibition of the various scientific projects made by children was part of the programme. Prizes were awarded for the best entries.

Presented a baby incubator to Vani Vilas Hospital at Basavangudi, Bangalore.

1970 - 71

President: Rtn. R.Giridhar Secretary: Rtn. C.V.Narayana Row

Completed the project of supplying drinking water to Sakalavara village under the R.I.World Community Services Programme. Financial contributions came from the Rotary

Club of Mount Royal, and the project was inaugurated by the President of India, Shri V.V.Giri.

Donated Rs.25,000/- to set up the Rotary Club of Bangalore Outpatient Ward of the Sri Venkateswara ENT Clinic at the Victoria Hospital.

Contributed the club's share of Rs.12,500/- help Begur village to get drinking water facilities at a total cost of Rs.2.6 lakh.

Completed the electrification and renovation of the Chinnappa Primary School.

Donated uniforms to students of the Adamar Ashram School on Devanahalli Road.

Donated books to the Begur Village High School Library.

Provided drugs to the Begur Dispensary and Krishna Seva Ashram.

The Inner Wheel Club joined the International Inner Wheel.

The Rotaract Club organized the first Rotary Science Fair.

A Rs.25,000/- Central Government grant and an additional amount, both aggregating to give an income of Rs.500/- a month by way of interest, were used to start a Child Welfare Trust in a slum area.

A team of six professionals and businessmen was deputed for an eight-week tour of Cleveland, Ohio, U.S.A., under the G.S.E. programme.

Donated mattresses to Anatha Sishu Nivas.

1971 - 72

Organised a three day career Exhibition-cum-conference for prospective college students, to provide first hand information on the various careers open to them after completing their education or to direct educational opportunities to their taste. This had the co-operation and assistance of the Directorate of Employment and Training, Employment Information and Guidance Bureau, Bangalore University Educational and Vocational Guidance Bureau and the Industrial Training Institute.

Contributed Rs.15,000/- to the National Defence Fund.

1972 -73

Secretary: Rtn. V.Ramachandran

Organised a full-day Career Guidance Seminar which attracted more than 400 students. Information was disseminated on a wide variety of professions. The Bangalore University Guidance Bureau subsequently published the entire proceedings of the Seminar for the benefit of the student community. In all, 19 professions were discussed by well known authorities in each.

Collaborated with the State Chidren's Welfare Committee and the Dakshina Bharata Mahila Sangham in the construction of the Bal Bhavan and a play ground for children at Kadugodi village.

Sponsored the Interact Club at Kendriya Vidyalaya, MEG Centre.

1973 - 74

President: Rtn. C.V.Narayana Row Secretary: G.K.Rajan

Established sister club relations with the Rotary Club of Komoro, Japan. An agreement to this effect was signed on October 15 by the presidents of the Clubs. This was the first agreement by any Rotary Club in India with an overseas club.

Presented an ambulance van costing Rs.45,000/- to St. Martha's Hospital for round-the-clock service to the community. The entire amount for the project was collected in just 87 days.

Arranged for regular water supply at Immidihalli village near Whitefield and Sakalawara village.

A few Rotarian families hosted for a year, a student from Tuaiatin, Oregon, U.S.A., sponsored by the Tigard Rotary Club, U.S.A, under the Rotary Youth Exchange programme.

Donated Rs. 10,000/- to the Navajeevana Nilaya for putting up shed needs for the rehabilitation of lepers.

Organised the face-lift of a school in Bapagram village through Rotaractors.

1974 – 75

President: Rtn. Ashok C. Mody Secretary: P.T.Kasturi

Launched the Mid-day Meal Scheme for poor and deserving college students. The Scheme provided for a square meal for day scholars from poor families coming from far-off places, who would otherwise have to go without a meal. Under the Scheme, each donor had to pay Rs.250/- for annual expenses. (The scheme is still being continued).

Organised an Exhibition on Self-Employment Careers which was visited by over 2,000. Many small-scale entrepreneurs, Karnataka State Finance Corporation, leading banks, Directorate of Small Industries Service Institute of the Government of India, Employment Guidance Bureau and Consultancy Services participated.

Opened a Blood Donation Centre at St. Martha's Hospital in commemoration of the 70th anniversary of Rotary, to benefit both private and Government hospitals. This was a

programme conceived by Rtn. P.T.Kasturi. The first blood collection for the Centre was arranged at the Rotary House of Friendship on February 22, 1975, coinciding with the 70th anniversary of the Rotary movement. The Club was awarded the Indian Red Cross Rolling Shield for the largest contribution of blood during 1975

Presented a large amount of equipment to benefit mentally challenged pupils at Baldwin Girls High School.

Received and hosted three Youth Exchange students from U.S.A.

Inaugurated the Interact Club of Bishop Cotton Boys High School. Inaugurated the Road Safety Patrol at Bishop Cotton Boys High School. Gave Rs. 50/- each, for books or educational aids to provide for the wholesome development of college

students who in return would undertake to do social service like giving free tuition to school children and visiting slums to render help.

Donated essential equipment like an oxygen cylinder, refrigerator and weighing machine for babies to the combined dispensary at Kadugodi village.

Reconstructed the buildings, where Rtn. M.K.Ramachandra led the G.S.E. looms were installed, at Navajeevana Nilaya for the rehabilitation of lepers. Also rebuilt a well, provided pump and a roof for the poultry shed. The carpentry section was improved. Provided capital equipment to enable self-sufficiency.

Donated Rs.50,000/- for a library and reading room at the Poorna Prajna Education Centre at Sadashivanagar.

1975 - 76

Presented the Citizen Extraordinaire Award to Dr. R.Marthanda Varma, Director of the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences, for his outstanding contribution to the community.

1976 - 77

President: Rtn. G.K.Rajan Secretary: Rtn. M.P.Talwar

Established the Rotary Centre for Work Experience to encourage school children to learn through experiments, not by classroom studies alone, and in turn to develop their creative faculties. The Centre was formally inaugurated by Shri Mallikarjuna Kharge, Minister for Primary and Secondary Education, Karnataka State, on October 8. To mark this, a Work Experience Contest was organized and about 60 models made by children were displayed at the

Club.

This Centre is part of the Work Experience programme introduced earlier by the Club in St. Joseph's Boys High School, Bishop Cotton Boys High School, St. John's High School and Vijaya High School. Subsequently, 16 Corporation Schools were included. The proposal was to train 20 teachers and 40 children from 20 schools initially. For the other areas of the State, teachers were to be trained and they, in turn, were to motivate the students.

Even to this day, the Centre remains the only one of its kind in the country.

No. of students on an average of 25 schools per year from 1976-77 to 1984-85 is 45,625. Initiated the Centre for Human Development. This is programmed to educate the mentally challenged, exceptionally brilliant and normal children, all under one roof. The Centre is to be divided into two sections. Section A will train children to move into further vocational and educational set-ups. Section B will look after those needing longer, more careful attention.

The Centre will be on a 30 acre plot at Bethalsur in Yelahanka, donated by Rtn. G.Ramarathanam.

The project, based on R.I.President Adopted Tavarekere village on Ernesto Imbassahy de Mello's theme 'Dignify the Human Being', was formally launched on December 20.

This is now being looked after by a Trust specially formed for the purpose. The Trust has already started two skill training centers in Bangalore to develop vocational skills among the mentally challenged. These will eventually merge with the Centre at Yelahanka, when the buildings are ready.

Conducted a Workshop on Standards and Quality Evaluation for small-scale industrialists.

Established sister club relations with the Rotary Club of Petalingjaya in Malaysia. The agreement was signed on April 14.

Bannerghatta Road. The school building was renovated and the students were given slates and books.

Organised the first combined meeting of all the Rotary Clubs in Bangalore in honour of Rtn. George Uhlig, First Vice-President of Rotary International (1973-74).

Presented a mobile medical van costing Rs.56,000/- to Anatha Seva Ashrama Trust, Malladihalli in Chitradurga District.

After a survey, the Trust entrusted Rtn. Bimaji to handle the project. Two villages, Thathaguni and Vasanthapura on Kanakapura Road, were selected. Ever since, a team of four doctors with Rtn. Bimaji has been going to the village every week.

1977 - 78

President: Rtn. Dr. N.R.Narayan Secretary: Rtn.P.Jagannath

Sponsored the Interact Club in St. Joseph's Indian High School.

R.I. President Jack Davis who made a stop over at the HAL airport on his way from Bombay to Mangalore, was given a reception.

1978 - 79President:Rtn. P.T.Kasturi Secretary: Rtn. C. Vijayam Jagannathan

At Tavarekere, a school building costing Rs.60,000/- put up by the Inner Wheel Club and Rotaractors, was inaugurated on October 2. The Rotaractors had earlier renovated the existing building and provided drinking water facilities for the village. The School was handed over to the Corporation of the City of Bangalore which runs it now.

The Club received the Significant Achievement Award from Rotary International.

An intensive study was made of the sales tax, octroi and other taxes payable on different consumer products. Charts were made available at retail shops to give an idea to the consumers of the exact taxes payable.

Mr. N. Lakshmana Rau, former Administrator of the City Corporation of Bangalore, was presented with the 'Citizen Extraordinaire Award' for the significant contribution he had made to the development and maintenance of Bangalore.

Rtn. Pres. P.T.Kasturi led the G.S.E. Team to District 777, South Carolina, U.S.A. A candidate sponsored by the Club was a member of the team. Received and hosted a team of Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Komoro, Japan.

A student from Australia, sponsored by comprehensive, interesting and the Rotary Club of Alburry North, District 979, was hosted for a year by a few Rotarian families.

1979 - 80President: Rtn. M.P.Talwar Secretary: Rtn. K.S.Krishnamurthy

As a major project during R.I.'s 75th Anniversary, constructed 15 janata houses each at Begur and Kodichikkanahalli, and donated them to poor and deserving families.
